State Personal Income Taxes on Retirement Income

WV State and local police, Deputy Sheriffs', Firefighters' and Military retirement benefits are fully exempt.

Other WV State pensions: \$2,000 exemption.

Federal Civil Service pensions: \$2,000 exemption.

Each WV Taxpayer aged 65 or older is entitled to a deduction of \$8,000 minus Retirement income deduction (\$2,000 mentioned above). In this statute, retirees \$6,000 plus the \$2,000 mentioned above.

Legislative Goals 2019

- That WVARSE will promote legislation to continue and maintain the quality of PEIA coverage
- That WVARSE will promote legislation to establish a 1 percent tax on Marcellus, Utica and other lower sand gases together with a 1 percent severance tax on any future cracker plants as a funding source for state public employee's retiree benefits
- That WVARSE will promote legislation to increase the minimum pension to \$750.00 per month for those retirees with at least 20 years of service.

Contact your Delegates and Senators and share our goals with them. Contact members of the Finance and Pensions Committees and ask them to support our bills in committee.

Summary of Retiree Increases Since 1998

PERS

2000 - All retirees with 20 or more years of service were guaranteed a minimum annuity of \$500/month.

2001 - All retirees age 65 retired for 5 years or more received a 5% increase

All retirees age 70 retired for 5 or more years received a 10% increase.

All early retirees age 65 retired for 5 or more years received a 3% increase.

2006 - All retirees age 70 retired 5 or more years received a 3% increase.

2008 - 13th check of \$600 to retirees w/20 yrs and annual benefit of \$7200 or less adjusted.

2011 - 13" check of \$1200 to retirees w/20 yrs and annual benefit of \$7200 or less.

TRS

1998 - All retirees who retired on or after 7/1/1986 but before 4/1/1998 received a \$2 @month for every year of service. All retirees who retired before 4/1/1988 and who were receiving less than or equal to \$300 received an additional \$1 @ month for each year of service.

2000 - All retirees with 20 or more years of service were guaranteed a minimum annuity of \$500 monthly.

2001 - All retirees age 65 retired for 5 years or more received a 5% increase

All retirees age 70 retired for 5 or more years received 10% increase.

All early retirees age 65 retired for 5 or more years received a 3% increase.

2006 - All retirees age 70 retired for 5 or more years received 3% increase.

2008 - 13th check of \$600 to retirees w/20 yrs and annual benefit \$7200 or less adjusted.
