Our Legislative efforts are multiple this year. Our first goal is to keep PEIA as it is into the future. The upcoming plan year is the last year for no change in premiums, copays, or deductibles unless the state takes action. We are working with other organizations to coordinate efforts on PEIA. We need all our members to be in contact with their Legislators.

Another thing that has come to light is that there is talk among the Legislators about a tax cut. Not a bad idea, you might say, but one of the methods to “pay” for such a tax cut is not so good. It has been suggested that the state might cut costs by

slowing the payoff on the unfunded liability in our pension fund by an additional 17 years. That would mean that our pension fund would not be fully funded in 2034 as we have been promised, but not until 2051. As you may realize, any chance of a Cost-of-Living-Adjustment (COLA) in the near future evaporates with this plan. We MUST pull out all stops to prevent this. We will work with other organizations on this as well, but our grass roots have to step up here too.

We will still be working on a modest pension increase for those who retired 20 or more years ago. They are the ones that have been most impacted by inflation. We have to work to help them.

We don't know what this Legislative session will look like with the COVID. The Legislators and staff may well have been vaccinated by then. What we do know is that the grass roots (YOU) needs to work extra hard this year. Your letters, e-mails, texts, or phone calls just may make the difference in what happens for us or to us this year.

A change has been made to register for a Covid vaccine.

If you have internet, enter vaccinate.wv.gov.

If you have no internet, call 1-633-734-0965.

At this time, you must be 65 or older. Give any health conditions that you have. This may help you get the vaccination sooner. If you have already been vaccinated, be sure to follow up with the second shot.

West Virginia Association of Retired School Employees WVARSE LEGISLATIVE GOALS 2021

- That WVARSE will promote legislation to continue and maintain the quality of PEIA coverage, without increases in premiums, copays or reduction in benefits.
- That WVARSE will promote Legislation to provide a stimulus check of \$500 to each retiree that retired 20 or more years ago when a state of emergency is declared for a pandemic.
- That WVARSE will promote legislation to increase the pension of those who retired 20 or more years ago by two dollars per month per year of service.
- That WVARSE will support AARP efforts at the legislature.

State Personal Income Taxes on Retirement Income

- WV State and local police, Deputy Sheriffs' and Firefighters' retirement benefits are fully exempt. Other WV State pensions: \$2,000 exemption.
- Federal Civil Service pensions: \$2,000 exemption.
- Military Pensions: Full exemption.
- Each WV Taxpayer aged 65 or older is entitled to a deduction of \$8,000 minus Retirement income deduction (\$2,000 mentioned above). In this statute, retirees \$6,000 plus the \$2,000 mentioned above.

A Brief History of Legislative Changes to PEIA

The Legislature created the PEIA in 1988, and the PEIA Finance Board in 1990.

- 1988** reduced sick leave benefit by 50% starting 7/1/88
- 1989** passed Omnibus Health Care Act – allows PEIA to set rates, stopped balance billing by in-state providers, required providers to accept assignment of benefits
- 1990** created PEIA Finance Board
- 1991** Dropped “take-one-take-all” provision from the Omnibus Health Care Act, expanding available provider pool for PEIA insureds
- 1992** Prevented ‘pre-existing condition limitation’ from being applied to new hires
- 1994** Added 100% coverage for childhood immunizations and associated office visits to PEIA Indemnity Plan
- 1998** Changed PEIA plan year to state’s fiscal year; provided supplemental appropriation to avoid deductible and copay increases effective 1/1/99
- 1999** Expanded PEIA Finance Board by two members, required 5-year finance plans
- 2001** Ended practice of trading accrued leave for health insurance for those hired on and after 7/1/2001
- 2002** passed legislation to require 80/20 premium split for agencies in the State-funded plan
- 2008** Created Retiree Health Benefit Trust Fund to deal with the state’s OPEB liability
- 2009** Eliminated benefit for higher education faculty to trade years of teaching service for years of employer-paid insurance at retirement
- 2017** Reconstituted finance board

Summary of Retiree Increases Since 1998

PERS

- 2000** - All retirees with 20 or more years of service were guaranteed a minimum annuity of \$500/month.
- 2001** - All retirees age 65 retired for 5 years or more received a 5% increase
All retirees age 70 retired for 5 or more years received a 10% increase.
All early retirees age 65 retired for 5 or more years received a 3% increase.
- 2006** - All retirees age 70 retired 5 or more years received a 3% increase.
- 2008** - 13th check of \$600 to retirees w/20 yrs and annual benefit of \$7200 or less adjusted.
- 2011** - 13” check of \$1200 to retirees w/20 yrs and annual benefit of \$7200 or less.
- 2019** - HB 3095 increased the minimum pension for school employees and state employees with at least 25 years of service from \$500 to \$750 per month.

TRS

- 1998** - All retirees who retired on or after 7/1/1986 but before 4/1/1998 received a \$2 @month for every year of service.
All retirees who retired before 4/1/1988 and who were receiving less than or equal to \$300 received an additional \$1 @ month for each year of service.
- 2000** - All retirees with 20 or more years of service were guaranteed a minimum annuity of \$500 monthly.
- 2001** - All retirees age 65 retired for 5 years or more received a 5% increase
All retirees age 70 retired for 5 or more years received 10% increase.
All early retirees age 65 retired for 5 or more years received a 3% increase.
- 2006** - All retirees age 70 retired for 5 or more years received 3% increase.
- 2008** - 13th check of \$600 to retirees w/20 yrs and annual benefit \$7200 or less adjusted.
- 2011** - 13th check of \$1200 to retirees w/20 yrs and annual benefit \$7200 or less.
- 2019** - HB 3095 increased the minimum pension for school employees and state employees with at least 25 years of service from \$500 to \$750 per month.
